

Biblical tours

GETTING STARTED

The following key elements can help create a good trip experience.

Vision/Purpose

Knowing the vision and purpose of the trip will guide the creation of an itinerary and can help identify the places you want to visit.

- Why do you want to go to Israel?
- What do you want the team to take away from the experience?

Set Trip Dates

When determining travel dates the following should be considered:

- Avoid traveling June-August, due to the heat and check the calendar for both Jewish and Muslim holidays when planning a trip.
- Avoid arriving on a Saturday, as it is Shabbat and hotels are not vacated until after sunset.
- Most hotels and preferred tour guides are booked 18-24 months out.

Select Tour Company

The selection of a tour company is a foundational component of the trip experience. Make sure the tour company selected shares the same vision and biblical perspective.

Tour Companies in Israel will coordinate the land package from airport pick-up, tour bus, guide, and hotels. They also have experienced staff to help with creating an itinerary. Gateway uses Sar-El Tours or Keshet Journeys Tour agencies.

Itineraries

We have designed two unique trip experiences to provide opportunities for continuous learning.

Finances

A travel agency can assist in calculating trip cost. When using an agency to coordinate the trip details, expect a mark-up on trip cost. This example budget is a helpful tool in calculating expenses.

Team Preparation

- Prayer: Establish a prayer team for the group. Encourage each team member to ask friends/family to pray for them during each stage of the trip. Physical and spiritual attacks will arise before the trip, so it is important to stand firm against those in the full armor that God has given us, prayer is a part of that armor! (Ephesians 6:10-18)
- Walk: Israel is very hilly with lots of steps and steep climbs/descents on rocky, unpaved paths should be expected. Encourage team to prepare their physical body. There are no ADA standards in Israel.
- Build Community: Gathering as a team, prior to departure, creates a stronger sense of community which can improve the overall trip experience.

Some say that you don't go to Israel, but instead, that you are sent to Israel. Spend time with the Lord and ask Him to reveal why He is sending you on this trip.
